LITERATURE REVIEW OF *SHATI* IN VARIOUS AYURVEDIC TREATISE

ABSTRACT

Hedychium spicatum Ham.ex Smith, commonly known as *Kapur Kachari* or *Shati* is one of the highly valued rhizomatous herbs useful in a wide range of diseases. The rhizomes of this plant give a stimulant effect on the respiratory system. In Ayurveda it is considered as a potent herb to cure diseases like cough, symptoms of cold, asthma, bronchitis. It is placed under *Hikka Nigrahan* and *Swashara Gana*. The *Guṇa-Karma* of *Shati* included *Laghu*, *Teekṣṇa*, *Guṇa*; *Kaṭu*, *Tikta*, *Kaṣhaya Rasa*; *Anuṣhṇa Veerya*. *Shati* was found to be as the ingredient of many formulations like *Chawanprasha*, *Agastya Haritaki Rasayana*, *Mahamayur Ghrit* and *Sudarshana Churna* and used in the treatment of cough, hiccup, fever and asthma and other respiratory problems. The rhizomes are considered useful as stomachic, carminative and stimulant for the treatment of liver disorders, food poisoning, inflammation, asthma pain, bronchitis and brain tonic. Various *Paryaya*, *Guna*, *Karma* and different opinions of *Acharyas* from various *Samhitas* were observed.

INTRODUCTION

Shati is a well-known aromatic drug and its rhizomes are used in Ayurveda and *Unani* system of medicine. Botanically, it has been identified as *Hedychium spicatum* Ham. ex. Smith (Family Zingiberaceae) as per API (Ayurvedic Pharmacopoeia of India)^[1].

Shati is a perennial rhizomatous herb, belonging to the family Zingiberaceae measuring upto 1m, found in parts of western and central regions of sub-tropical Himalayas at an altitude of 1500-2000m, grows abundantly in Kumaon and other Uttarakhand regions. The rhizomes have a strong aromatic odour and bitter camphoraceous taste. In local language, the rhizomes are commonly known as *Kapur Kachari* or *Ban Haldi*. Its rhizomes are used for making well-known tonic as well as food supplement called *Chayawanprash*. Its rhizomes are mentioned as *Shati* in ancient Ayurvedic classics and has been used in various dosage forms to treat cough, hiccup, fever and asthma and other respiratory problems.

Seeds were believed to cause an abortion and decoction of the rhizome with *Deodar* sawdust is taken for tuberculosis^[2].

An extensive description of *Shati* was found in many *Ayurvedic Samhitas* like *Sushrut Samhita*, *Charak Samhita*, *Bhavaprakasha Samhita*, *Ashtang Hridaya*, *Ashtanga Sangraha*, *Bhela*, *Harita*, *Kashyap* etc. In this article, a detailed review of *Shati* was done from *Samhitas* and *Rasa Granthas* like *Rastarangini* and *Rasaratnasamuccaya*.

MATERIAL AND METHODS

Shati in *Samhita kala*

Charak Samhita^[3, 4]

Shati has been mentioned in many chapters of *Sutra Sthanam*, *Chikitsa Sthanam* and *Siddhi Sthanam*. Use of *Shati* in various disorders and its inclusion as an ingredient in different formulations were found in *Charaka Samhita*^[16, 17].

RESULT AND DISCUSSION

In *Brhatrayi Shati* has been described at many places. In *Charaka-Samhita*, it has been described under *Hikkanigrahan* and *Swashara Mahakashaya*. It is also used as an important ingredient in different ayurvedic formulations i.e., *Cyavanaprasha*, *Agastya Haritaki*, *Amritprash Ghrit*, *Duralabhadya Ghrit*, *Jeevantyadi Ghrit*, *Mahamayur Ghrit*, *Lodhrasava* or *Madhavasava*.

In *Susruta Samhita* it has also been described under *Hingvadi Choorna*, *Dhanwantri Ghrit*, *Vidangadi Taila*, *Agastya Avleha*.

In *Ashtanga hrdaya* and *Ashanga Sangraha* it has been used for the treatment of *Kantkari Ghrit*, *Agastya Haritaki Rasayana*, *Jeevantyadi Churna*, *Pushkarmooladi Churna*, *Kashmaryadi Ghrit*, *Dashmooladi Ghrit*. In other *Samhita* and *Chikitsa Grantha* *Shati* has been mentioned as ingredient of various formulations and used to treat various disorders.

Shati was also described in *Rasaratna samaccaya* and *Rasatarangini*. In *Rasaratnasamaccaya* *Shati* has been described under *Vish Vidravan Ghrit*, *Visha Kalpa*, *Apchi Nasaka Visha* and *Madankameshwar Modak* but in *Rasatarangini* it has been described in only one formulation *Vish Vidravan Ghrit* for the treatment of different disorders by reading these *Samhitas* we found a very important role of *Shati* in *Kasa*, *Shwasa* and other respiratory ailments because most of the *Shati* formulations were found in treatment of these diseases. *Shati* was said to be as *Prashasth Aushadha* or *Param Aushadha* for *kasa*, *swasa* and *Hikka* in many *Samhitas*. After review of *Shati* in various *Nighantus* many synonyms of *Shati* were found.

Description of *Shati* was found in different *Nighantu* i.e., *Dhanwantari-Nighantu*, *Hridayadipaka Nighantu*, *Kaiyadeva-Nighantu*, *Madanpala-Nighantu* and *Bhavprakash-Nighantu* etc.

Shati is not found in *Vedic-Nighantu*, *Sausruta-Nighantu*, *Haramekhala-Nighantu*, *Ashtaang -Nighantu*, *Dravyaguna-Sangraha*, *Abhidhānaratnamala* or

Shadrassa-Nighantu, *Ayurveda-Mahodadhi*, *Sarasvati-Nighantu*, *Mahaushadha-Nighantu*.

Siddhasara-Nighantu considered *Karchur* as *Shati* and acc. to this *Nighantu* *Shati* is used now-a-days in place of *Karchur*.

In *Chamatkara -Nighantu* same names have been used for more than one drug. In this *Nighantu*, *plasha* is mentioned as the synonym of *Shati*.

In *Dhanwantri-Nighantu* along with *Shati*, *Gandhplashi* (*Shati Vishesh*) is also mentioned in *Guduchyadi Varga*.

In *Hridyadipaka-Nighantu* second type *Gandhplash* is also mentioned.

In *Raja-Nighantu* also, *Shati Vishesh* is mentioned in *Pippalyadi Varga*.

In *Shaligram-Nighantu* *Shati* has been described under *Karpuradi Varga* but no synonyms are found in this *Nighantu*.

In *Abhidhanamanjari* *Shati* has been described under *Sankeeran Varga*, *Trayarth-Varga* but no synonyms and properties are mentioned. Only name *Shati* is mentioned.

Shati is *Katu*, *Tikta* and *Kashaya* in *rasa* almost acc.to every *Nighantu* but *Raja Nighantu* also included *Amla Rasa*.

Shati has *Laghu* and *Teekshna Guna* and has *Katu Vipaka* acc. to *Adarsh Nighantu*. It is used to treat *Kasa*, *Swasa*, *Hikka*, *Varna*, *Sidham*, *Shool*, *Chardi*, *Mukh Sodhani* and *Tamak swasa*.

Acc. to *Dhanwantri Nighantu*, *Raja Nighantu*, *Nighantu Adarsha* and *Priya Nighantu* *Shati* has *Ushna Veerya*. Acc. to *Madanpala Nighantu* and *Shankara Nighantu* *Shati* has *Sheeta Veerya*.

Acc. to *Kaiyadeva Nighantu*, *Bhavaprakasha Nighantu* and *Gunaratnamala Shati* has *Anushna Veerya*.

CONCLUSION

The extensive review of *Shati* in various Ayurvedic treatise like *Samhitas*, *Nighantu*, *Kosha Grantha* and *Rasa Grantha* concluded to the fact that *shati* have a wide range of therapeutic qualities as it is

seen in the treatment of numerous diseases in the form of an individual Dravya itself. Shati been mentioned in ancient Samhitas and Nighantu indicates its established use since many years. This extensive review of the plant Shati will bring to light its underrated importance and help the Ayurvedic practitioners in various ailments. It will also make it easy for the Ayurvedic scholars to conduct further research studies on Shati.
